The Direct Debit guarantee

- If there are any changes to the amount, date or frequency of your Direct Debit the Royal College of Physicians will notify you not less than 10 working days in advance of your account being debited or as otherwise agreed. If you request the Royal College of Physicians to collect a payment, confirmation of the amount and date will be given to you at the time of the request.
- If an error is made in the payment of your Direct Debit, by the Royal College of Physicians or your bank or building society, you are entitled to a full and immediate refund of the amount paid from your bank or building society.
- > If you receive a refund you are not entitled to, you must pay it back when the Royal College of Physicians asks you to.
- You can cancel a Direct Debit at any time by simply contacting your bank or building society. Written confirmation may be required. Please notify the RCP if you cancel your Direct Debit.
